Last year's report: surplus 3500, investment gain 1700 = 5200 – but owe 3000 to

SR and \$130 IAHR.

We are bringing in changes to compensate for loss of SSHCR travel funds, some in effect this year.

We still projected loss of \$6000 but this not as bad as it looks (\$3000 to CCSR actually for this year).

We have reviewed investments – plan to take 2.5% or about 1500 from investment income again to make up for loss of SSHRC travel funds.
