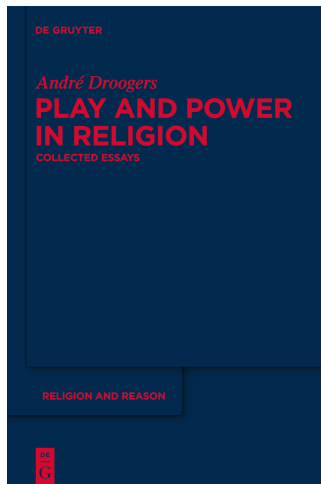
Key Topics:
