Professor David Tacey is a public intellectual and recognised international authority in Jungian psychology, spirituality and mental health. Over many years he has applied his insights to the analysis and articulation of the contemporary Australian spiritual condition, offering clarity and vision for those who seek to work intelligently and holistically in human flourishing. He is the author of fourteen books, including Edge of the Sacred (1995/2009), ReEnchantment (2000), and The Spirituality Revolution (2003). His most recent book is Gods and Diseases: Making Sense of Our Physical and Mental Wellbeing (2011).



Maxine Green is a recognised UK authority on the relationships between spirituality, youth development, youth work and professional ethics. In this contested and often controversial space Maxine brings clarity, balance, warmth and wisdom. Her latest writing is a contributing chapter on 'The use of the spiritual self in youth work practice', soon to be published in, Youth Work and Faith: Debates, Delights and Dilemmas (Russell House, 2014). Maxine is the Principal of the YMCA George Williams College, London, a leading Higher and Further Education provider for degree-qualified Youth and Community Workers.

CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION



Dr Phil Daughtry is Head of School, Humanities and Social Sciences, at Tabor Adelaide. He has a long term interest in contemporary spirituality and youth work and has been active for many years in facilitating conversation and inquiry around this topic, including a UK forum at Durham University in 2012 which produced the *Durham Accord*. Phil has published in the area of Christian spirituality for young people [*The Sacred Life of Us*, 2003] and in the place of spirituality in youth work curriculum (2010 and 2012).

If it takes a village to raise a child what would a holistic practice of spiritual formation with young people look like in contemporary Australian society?

The youth life-stage is generally understood as a time of openness, exploration and questioning in terms of identity, autonomy, agency and vocation. The opportunity for young people to access spiritual resources, wisdom, mentors, communities and traditions is vitally important to the formation of their holistic sense of self, social participation and responsibility. But what does this mean in a predominantly secular culture and society with an Anglo-Christian heritage, multi-cultural pluralism, tentative respect for the Aboriginal story and the spirituality of the land and declining participation in traditional forms of religious practice?

This conference aims to draw together a variety of perspectives and views on the question above, including experienced youth workers, social thinkers and commentators and the voices of young people themselves. The common thread in our conversation is that we think the spiritual dimension of the psyche is important for the human story and that young people have the right to receive access to this.
