

CANDIDATES FOR A RESEARCH:

LAÏCITÉ, ISLAMOPHOBIA AND LIVING RELIGION IN QUÉBEC

We are looking for North African people who identify as Muslims for doctoral research. To fit into the criteria, you need to be aged 18 to 45 and living, studying or working in Montreal or Quebec.

As candidate, you would be willing to be interviewed about your perceptions of issues related to secularism in Quebec and recently adopted legislative measures (Bill 62 (2017) on the obligation to give and to receive State services with their faces uncovered, and Bill 21 (2019) on secularism and the prohibition of the wearing of a religious sign by certain persons in the exercise of their functions). Then, we will address the question of Islamophobia from the way you live your religion on a daily basis, in school or in the workplace, since the attack on the mosque of January 29, 2017.

Your participation is voluntary and will consist of a semi-directed face-to-face or online interview, depending on your preferences. Your anonymity will be preserved, and the data collected will be confidential. The interview will take between one hour and, at most, three hours of your time.
